

ADVISING LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING NOTES

Monday, May 9, 2022

Advising Update from Statewide

- No Statewide Meeting was held, so there was no update.
- L. Vega shared that one ongoing issue currently is concerning advisors access to student's financial aid data, and issue that has been raised in the statewide advisors' listserv. Having access can allow advisors to provide reminders, point out missing documents, and inform students on the nature of holds and how to remove those holds. Access to such records varies across all CSU's, which is also the case at CSUB, and D. Jackson shared that at CSUB this can be an Academic Barrier.
- The second issue at hand is with respect [AB 928](#). AB 928 will ensure a common general education transfer of units across community colleges, CSUs, and UCs. With this law, the school systems involved will need to make compromises. The [ICAS](#) (Intersegmental Committee of Academic Senate) has established an agreed [AB-928 Implementation Timeline](#) and a proposed a *course map* that now will be voted by each of the systems' academic senates. There may be more revisions before it goes to each systems' governing boards, for CSU it will be the the Board of Trustees.

Immunization holds

- L. Gubkin shared that there are currently around 2000 students with an immunization hold, of those some have done nothing to remove the holds and the others are currently in the process of getting an appointment to clear those holds.

Academic Senate Advising Issues

- L. Vega shared that '[RES 212226](#) General Studies Review Committee Implementation' and '[RES 212228](#) Re-Entry Students Policy—3-year grace, if good standing' had passed in the Senate and were approved by the President (5/12/2022).

Advising Task Force

- Y. Morones shared that the ATF group asked for an incomplete because although they currently have a recommendation its not where they would want it to be. They hope they will be approved to further work on their recommendation in the summer and be able to present in the fall.

Professional Development

- 32 people are taking advantage of the 8-hour Mental Health First Aid certification, which is set to take place on May 18 and May 19.

Schools Administrative Assessment Review

- The assessments are still pending, L. Vega hopes they will be able to have them done to share during the summer.
