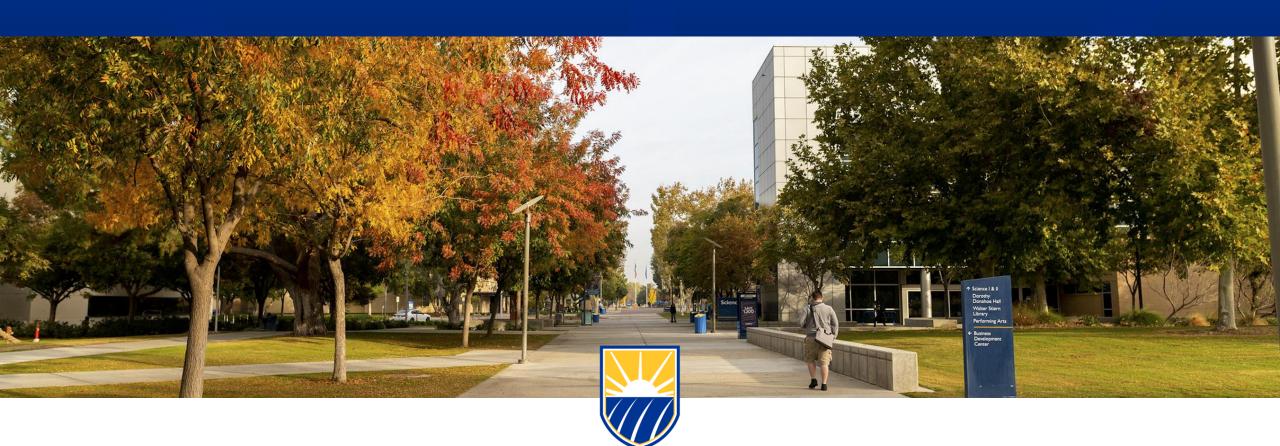

Basic Budget Terms

General Operating Fund Sources:

- State General Fund Allocation (approximately 63-66%)
- Student Tuition (33-35%)

General Operating Fund Uses:

- Covers salaries and benefits for faculty & staff (78%)
- Funds operational costs such as supplies, utilities, and insurance (10%)
- Provides tuition grants (financial aid) (12%)

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Implementing a New Instructional Budget Model

- Short Term:
 - Allocate resources based on student needs
 - Realign class sizes to pre-pandemic levels
- Long Term:
 - Align resource allocations based on student demand, high impact programs, and university priorities
 - Allows us to make data-informed decision making
 - Improves transparency and accountability

- Short-Term
 - Utilize savings related to vacant positions
 - Explore underutilized funding sources
 - Explore operational efficiencies and cost-saving measures
- Long-Term
 - Increase and diversify revenue sources
 - Increase recruitment and retention of students
 - Increase public-private partnerships (P3) opportunities

Budget Advisory Committee

The functions of the Budget Advisory Committee (BAC) shall be to:

- Monitor budget resources and progress toward the achievement of the University's strategic plan and related goals and objectives.
- Review the University's strategic plan and institutional metrics and data, and to identify budget resources required to support the plan.
- Advise the President's Cabinet on the status of the strategic plan and to provide the President's Cabinet with a priority list of budget allocation recommendations for achieving the University's strategic plan, supporting the University's academic mission, and ensuring the University's financial viability considering the on-going fiscal challenges and opportunities.
