### **TYPES OF AID**

- Grants
  - Need-based money without repayment
- Scholarships
  - Merit or performance-based money without repayment.
- Federal Loans
  - Fixed low interest rate money that has to be rapid.
    - Subsidized
      - Does <u>NOT ACCRUE</u> interest while in school
      - · Need based loan as determine by school
    - Unsubsidized
      - ACCRUE interest while in school
      - · Not Based on financial need



# **GRANTS AVAILABLE TO CREDENTIAL STUDENTS**

### **TYPES OF AID**

#### Cal Grant Teach Grant

 Undergraduate Cal Grant A and B recipients who plan to enroll in a teaching credential program (TCP) after they receive their bachelor's degree may be eligible to renew their Cal Grant award for an additional year. The additional year of payment is provided to students who are seeking an initial teaching credential and cannot be used for other graduate-level courses of study

#### Teach Grant

• The TEACH Grant Program provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching. *Requires students to complete a teaching service obligation to receive the grant.* 

### State University Grant

 The State University Grant (SUG) is unique to the California State University (CSU) system and is funded from a percentage of CSU system-wide student tuition fee revenues. Limited allocations are provided to campuses based on their enrollment levels and other student data









### **TYPES OF AID**

#### Golden State Teach Grant

The Golden State Teacher Grant (GSTG) Program awards up to \$20,000 to students currently enrolled in a professional preparation program approved by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) and working towards earning their preliminary teaching or pupil personnel services credential. *Requires students to complete a teaching service obligation to receive the grant.*

### WHAT DETERMINES ELIGIBILTY?

- Aid is determined individually
- Each type of aid has specific requirements
- Only available for courses required by the state for credential students
- Undergraduate loan limits apply
- Classification status is important
- Number of units student is enrolled in





### **HOW TO APPLY?**

### **COMPLETE A FAFSA APPLICATION IF:**

- US citizens
- Permanent Resident
- Eligible Non-Citizens
- T-Visa holder

## COMPLETE THE CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT APPLICATION IF:

- Complete a Cal Dream Act:
- If a non-citizen who resides in CA:
- Undocumented
- Valid/Expired DACA
- U Visa holder
