Legal Immigration Services



Immigrant Legal Defense (ILD) provides free immigration legal services to eligible CSU individuals.

CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS RED CARDS AVAILABLE

You have constitutional rights:

- **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR** if an immigration agent is knocking. If you are inside of your house, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.
- **DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS** from an immigration agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- **DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING** without first speaking to a lawyer. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your house, **SHOW THIS CARD TO THE AGENT**. Ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say you can, leave calmly.

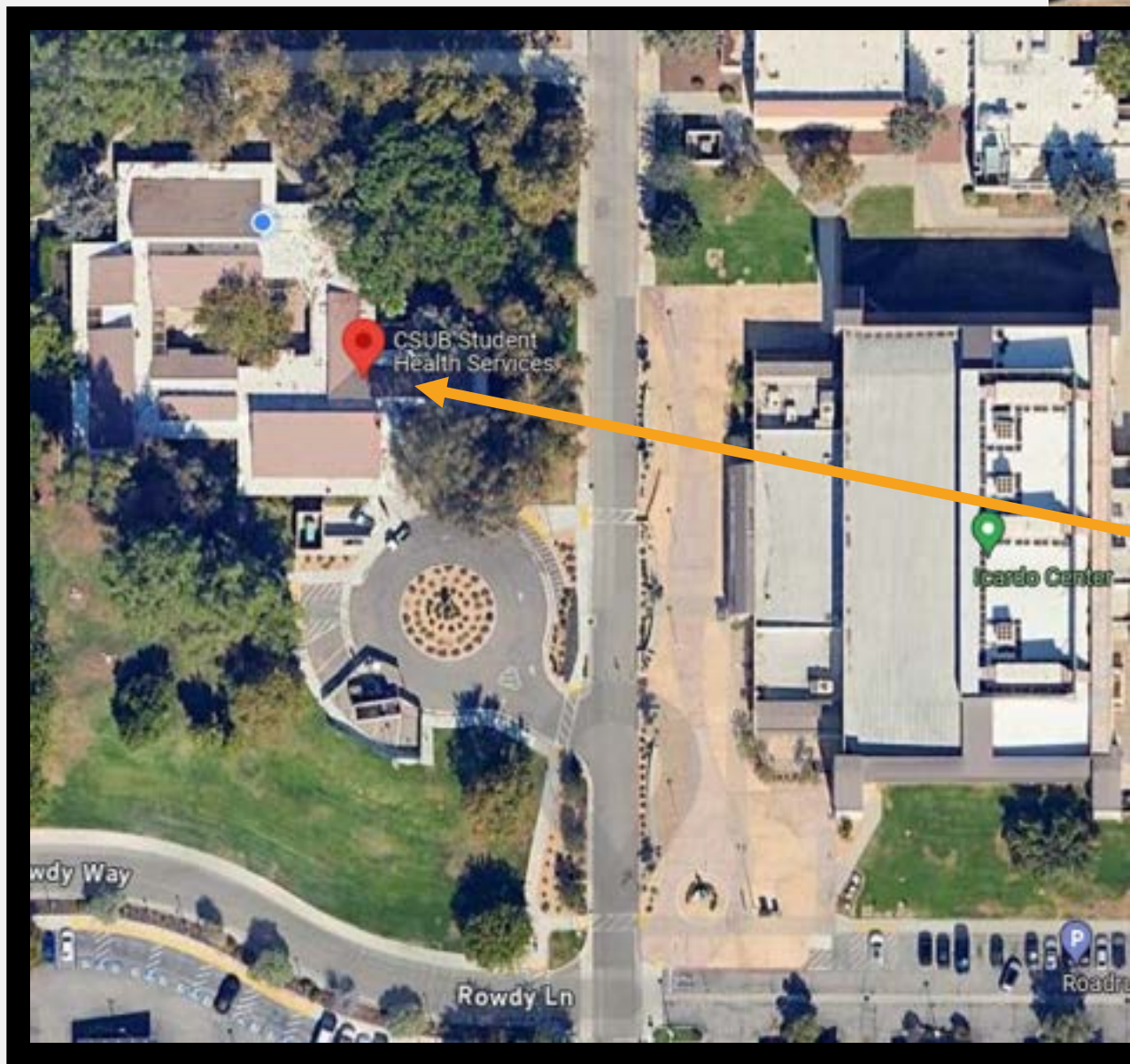

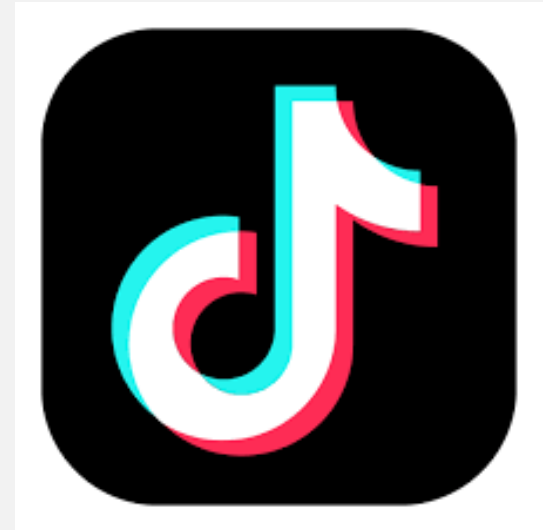

✦ On-Campus Emergency Housing

- students experiencing housing crisis may qualify for 30 days free of charge at student housing

✦ Off-Campus Emergency Housing

- Short-term support is available for currently displaced students who are not able to move into on-campus housing

Alumni Association Scholarship Program

Eligibility Criteria

Scholarship award applicants will be determined eligible according to the following criteria:

- Graduate or credential students (can be either an incoming or an established student).
- CSU Bakersfield graduate.
- Entering with, or currently has a cumulative GPA of 3.0. This GPA will be verified by review of the current academic transcript, and must be maintained throughout the academic year.
- Participation in extra-curricular activities that benefit the community and the university.
- Funds must be used within one year from the date of award or be returned to the CSU Bakersfield Foundation. The award must be applied for on a yearly basis.
- Funds are not transferable to another learning/teaching institution.
- Funds will be deposited in an account set up for the student at the university.
- The use of funds is restricted to the following school expenses:
 - (a) On-campus housing
 - (b) Fees
 - (c) Books
 - (d) Parking Permit

The CSUB Alumni Association awards scholarships to CSUB graduates pursuing their graduate degrees on campus. The Alumni Scholarship Endowment was established in 1990 with a gift of \$5,000 and is now valued at more than \$220,000.

The 2021-2022 academic year was record-breaking. The Alumni Association awarded \$25,000 in scholarships, the most it has ever given out in a single year and double what it gave the year before.

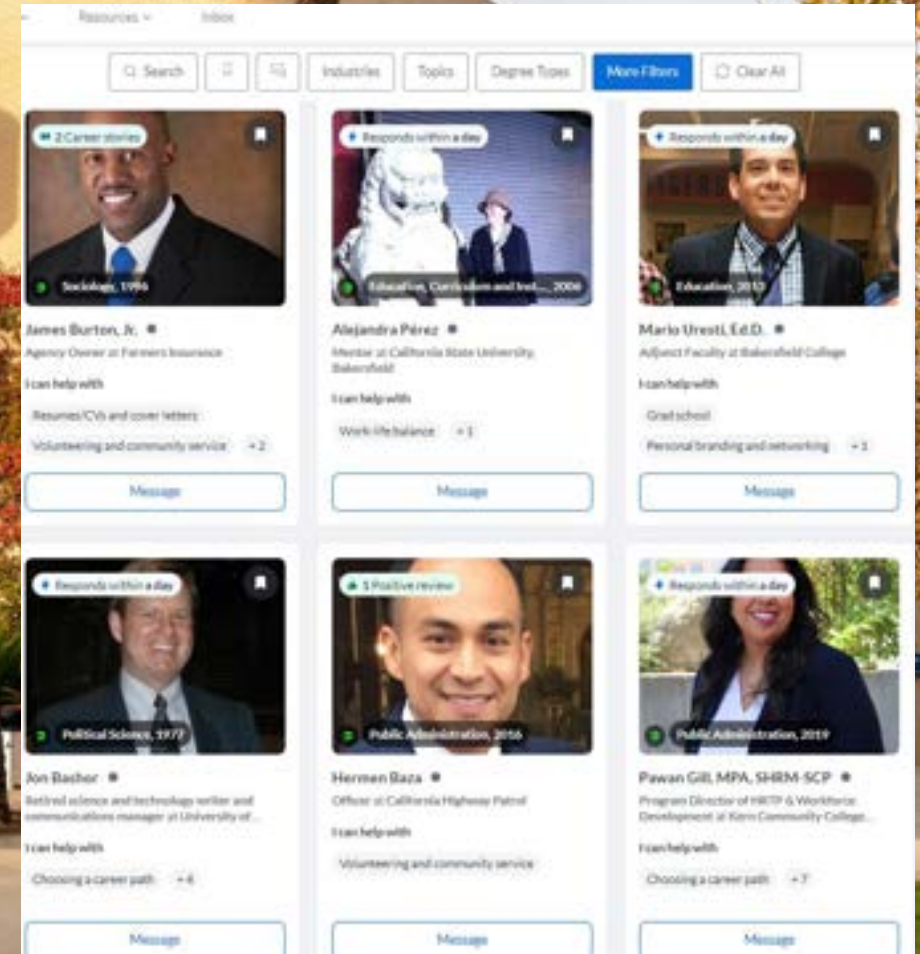
In 2024, the Alumni Association Board voted to contribute \$50,000 to the scholarship endowment. This is one of the largest contributions the Alumni Association Board has made toward its endowment - thanks to the generous community partners who support our programs. Four scholarship recipients were awarded a collective amount of \$8,000 to pursue their graduate school dreams.

Notice of Non-Discrimination on the Basis of Gender or Sex

CSU Bakersfield does not discriminate on the basis of gender, which includes sex and gender identity or gender expression, or sexual orientation in its education programs or activities.

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, and certain other federal and state laws, prohibit discrimination on the basis of gender or sexual orientation in employment, as well as in all education programs and activities operated by the University (both on and off campus), including admissions. The protection against discrimination on the basis of gender or sexual orientation includes sexual harassment, sexual misconduct, sexual exploitation, dating and domestic violence, and stalking.

What is Title IX?

- Title IX is a federal civil rights law passed as part of the Education Amendments of 1972.
- It **prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex** in any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.
- Applies to:
 - Protection against sex-based harassment
 - Protection against sexual misconduct (including sexual harassment, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and sexual exploitation)
 - Protection and adjustments for pregnant and parenting students (lactation rooms also available)
 - Gender equity in Athletics

Why Should I Care?

- It protects your **right to a safe and respectful learning environment**.
- It supports **equality in sports, academics, and campus life**.
- It ensures support for **survivors of sexual misconduct**.
- It includes protections for **pregnant students**.

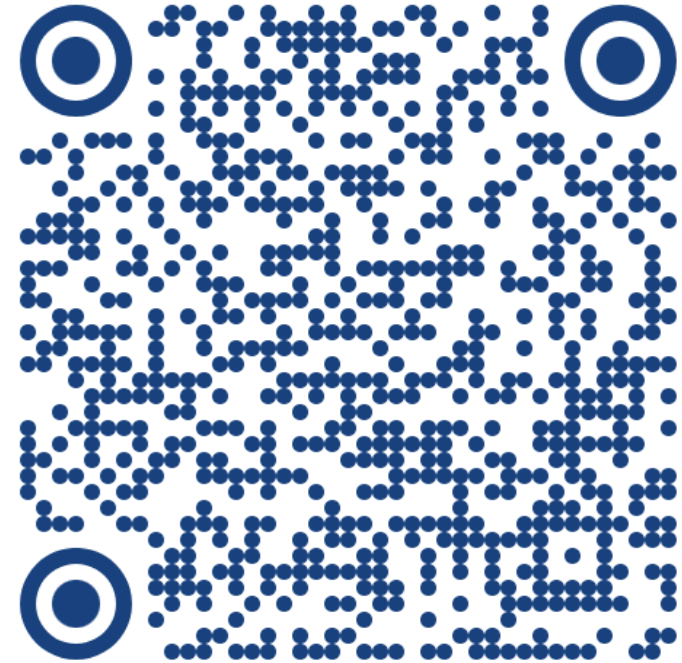

 - Supportive measures (e.g., class changes, no-contact orders)
 - Your rights and options
- You are **not required** to file a formal complaint to receive help.



Support for Pregnant Students

- Title IX protects you from discrimination due to:
 - Pregnancy
 - Childbirth
 - Recovery from childbirth
- You have the right to:
 - Reasonable adjustments (e.g., excused absences, larger desks)
 - Lactation spaces
 - Academic flexibility
