

CSUB is proud to remind all of its partnership with the Kern Community College District (KCCD) and Bakersfield College (BC) to bring you an opportunity to become a Fellow!

The Faculty Diversification Fellowship Program provides CSUB graduate students interested in teaching at a 2-year community college with an opportunity to participate in a mentorship collaboration with a BC faculty member. In addition, these CSUB graduate students will gain exposure to the community college culture, including best practices for teaching and supporting the diverse group of students enrolled at a rural California community college.

The Faculty Diversification Fellowship Program is open to all CSUB graduate students either in the last semester of their graduate programs or have recently graduated. Additionally, CSUB graduate students that:

- Come from underrepresented minority groups,
- Possess a passion for serving a diverse student body and exploring culturally relevant and inclusive teaching practices,
- Or are interested in pursuing a tenure-track position at a 4-year college or university are highly encouraged to apply!

The program recently welcomed the first Spring cohort this semester (pictured left), and applications will reopen April 5th through July 31st for the Fall 2024 cohort. Make sure to get your application in!

When applying, make sure that your application packet includes the following:

- 5 Professional References
- Cover Letter
- Current Resume
- Sample Syllabus
- Statement on your Philosophy of Teaching
- Transcripts (Official or Unofficial)

Though not required, it is highly recommended that you also submit the following:

- Letter of Recommendation
- Statement on your Diversity Philosophy Including these in your application makes it stand out from the rest!

## Support, Successes, and Ongoing Activities for Title Vb

Graduate programs at CSUB continue to benefit from the nearly \$3 million CSUB was awarded by the U.S. Department of Education to expand graduate research infrastructure, support graduate student recruitment and outreach, and offer special programs that support graduate student research. During the 2023-2024 academic year supported activities included workshops to strengthen graduate student support, delivering seminars to develop and support graduate research culture, and supporting graduate student research. Several faculty-student collaborative research teams were supported through the Graduate Student - Faculty Collaborative Research Program (GCRP) and many graduate students received funds through the STEM Travel Support for Student Researchers (TSSR) program. The grant also support participants in the annual Grad Slam and Student Research competitions. Look for many of these activities to continue in the current academic year!



This year, 7 graduate student and faculty teams have already been selected for the GCRP. Look to hear about their research, along with other graduate students, at the Grad Slam on December 6, 2024. Travel support for students may be requested through the TSSR program

This fall, we're spotlighting Dr. Michael Szolowicz, a dedicated member of the Educational Administration department, where he serves as chair of the Advanced Educational Studies.

With over 23 years of experience in educational administration in Tucson, Arizona, Dr. Szolowicz transitioned from teaching to administration to expand his impact on students and the community. After earning his Master's degree in Educational Administration from Northern Arizona University, he pursued a Ph.D. at the University of Arizona. With his learning he found fulfillment in academia's emphasis on writing and deep thinking; this was a refreshing change from the constant decision-making he had to make in administrative roles.

Since joining CSUB in 2018, Dr. Szolowicz has been instrumental in revitalizing the Educational Administration program and establishing the Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership as a standalone program. His real-world experience and deep theoretical knowledge have shaped stronger programs that benefit our students and the community.

While he appreciates Bakersfield's similarities to Tucson, including its diverse and vibrant community, he particularly enjoys being closer to the coast. Frequent family trips to Morro Bay have become a cherished part of his life in California.

Dr. Szolowicz's vision for educational leadership development at CSUB centers on empowering students with the knowledge and skills to lead impactful careers in education. For students considering this career path, he offers this candid advice: "There are no movie days in the front office." This profession demands resilience and constant problem-solving to drive meaningful change.

Dr. Szolowicz believes in making education hands-on and engaging, just like the philosophy of John Dewey from around 100 years ago. ## **Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)**

CSUB's Department of Nursing recently established two new Doctor of Nursing Practice programs: the **DNP-FNP Program** and the **MSN-DNP Program**. Both programs will accept their first cohorts beginning in Fall 2025.

#### **Department of Nursing Mission Statement:**

"The Department of Nursing fosters an environment that encourages lifelong learning and advancement within the profession. Graduates will have the acquired knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values essential to the practice of professional nursing. As professional nurses, our graduates will engage in evidence-based practice in an interprofessional healthcare environment. In recognition of the health needs of a multicultural society, professional nurses who are graduates of CSUB will address healthcare issues and needs of their community".

## **Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) - Family Nursing Practitioner (FNP) Degree Program:**

The <u>DNP-FNP program</u> strives to develop doctorally prepared nurse practitioners to combat the significant shortage of primary care providers in the region and to align with the evolving educational and scholarly standards for nurse practitioners. This three-year, eight-semester program is intended for registered nurses (RNs) with a Bachelor of Science (BS) or Master of Science (MS) in Nursing who are not currently Family Nurse Practitioners but wish to pursue doctoral preparation. Graduates of this program will be qualified to be certified as NPs by the State of California as well as qualified to earn an FNP furnishing number from the State of California. Graduates will also be prepared to take National FNP Certification exams.

## Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) to the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Degree Program:

The MSN-DNP Program is designed to address the evolving educational and scholarly standards for advanced nursing practice. This program taken full-time lasts four semesters ranging 15 months. This program is tailored for master's-prepared Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs)—including Nurse Practitioners (NPs), Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNSs), Nurse Anesthetists, and Nurse Midwives—who aspire to obtain the terminal degree in nursing and prepare for high-level autonomous clinical practice and interprofessional leadership. A part-time course schedule is also available for this program.


