#### I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Commuri called the meeting to order at 8:07 am.

### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The meeting minutes were approved. Stark motioned to approve the minutes, Livingston seconded, Olson, Zenko, & Olson abstained (6-3-0).

#### III. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commuri to remain on the board as a regular member and Olson will take on the role of Chair. Stark motioned to approve, and Wilson seconded (7-0-0).

Williamson was nominated as Vice-Chair by Stark as Williamson has served as Interim Chair in the past. Stark motioned to approve, and Sanchez seconded (8-1-0).

Zenko is now officially an alternate member of the HSIRB. Many thanks to Dr. Zenko for agreeing to serve.

Sumaya commented on her new role as the Interim AVP for GRaSP. The board members congratulated her.

Sumaya gave an update on the GRaSP Office telecommuting policy. Sumaya explained that by telecommuting, the GRaSP team can provide services & assistance to faculty with greater flexibility to work on their research, and while writing grants and developing budgets.

### V. OLD BUSINESS

A. The IRB policy regarding data storage was revisited. It is the desire of the IRB to make more formal and possibly utilize the DMP Tool (data management planning tool) as other IRBs do. Stark expressed concerns about the safety of storing data on memory

sticks and on cloud storage. Commuri suggested we create a cheat sheet with 4 or 5 points for reference. It was also discussed that adding a statement about data with identifiers where necessary would be included. The link to the DMP Tool was provided to the members to review again and provide feedback at the next meeting. Sumaya stated that when researchers choose to utilize the Qualtrics system for anonymous surveys, that it is required to check the box that IP addresses, email addresses, or identifiers will not be included.

- B. Wilson as alternate HSIRB member. Stark motioned to approve, and Wilson seconded (7-0-0). The full roster was reviewed for member term expirations. Sumaya will reach out to Joseph Florez to find out if he is interested in serving as an alternate member.
- C. The topic of Broad Consent was revisited and the need to discuss the details of utilizing this option for our researchers was acknowledged. The board was reminded that the revised IRB policy includes the Broad Consent option (Exempt Category 8, see 45 CFR 46.104(d)(8)). Olson spoke of a colleague who we could invite to come and speak to the board about Broad Consent. Broad Consent will need to be added to the questions on the Cayuse IRB form as well as the Informed Consent templates. Parnell mentioned the importance of specifying the category or what type of research will or will not be used for in future research studies.

#### IV. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Inclusionary statement selected to add to the Cayuse IRB protocol form. Stark motioned, Livingston seconded (7-0-0).
- B. Oral History policy working draft to be provided at the Fall II meeting.
- C. Review of the 2021-2022 Provost report, it was agreed to allow members one more week to review the document and provide feedback.
- D. Export Control Policy
- E. Updates on Cayuse IRB protocol forms, Parnell, Wilson, & Sumaya working on revising and updating in earnest, meeting weekly to get it done.

## V. FULL BOARD REVIEW PROTOCOLS [1]

1. 23-153: Inmate Defendant Remote Hearings, Jeanine Kraybill Votes: Olson motioned to approve, and Stark seconded (6-0-0).

After introductions, the PI provided an overview of the project. After a discussion and questions of clarification asked of the PI, the protocol was approved with the conditions. listed below.

1. Need to include specifics about the use of tablets. Please include:

a. statement in protocol that the device is provided by the prison for security reasons as there is no other possible way to get device to participants.
b. the process that will ensure that the participants' responses will not be viewed by the prison staff once they have completed the survey. Make mention that they will be able to log out on their own to assure privacy (Chain of custody of tablets).
c. make clear when, how and by whom, the tablets will be distributed. There was

mention in the meeting that the tablets would be distributed during "program" time and that the prisons guards would provide the tablets.

d. the script that guards will use when providing tablets to the participants. The script must include verbiage that makes it clear that guards cannot answers question about the study itself and can only answer questions about the use of the tablets. The script should include statements to the effect that the participants will not suffer any negative repercussions, retaliation for non-participation, or on the other end of the spectrum, any positive outcomes that may affect their parole etc. or better treatment if they do participate. Also, a statement needs to be made that no one will be able to link their answers to them personally and that their individual answers will not be reported back to the prison staff (this should also in the consent form information).

- 2. In the consent form, please include instructions on how the participants can contact CSUB IRB staff by letter (add CSUB Address for GRaSP) for concerns or complaints about their participation in the study.
- 3. Make sure to update your CITI training prior to its expiration date in January 2023.
- 4. In Cayuse revise your exclusion to include those that speak Spanish and add a Spanish version of your consent form.
- 5. Make sure in Qualtrics you design your survey to NOT include any identifiers when surveys have been completed.
