I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair McCleary called the meeting to order at 8:01 AM. There was a round of introductions.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

"More clear" should be changed to "clearer" in IVB [para 2]. Duran/Velasquez moved/seconded a motion to approve the minutes as corrected.

III. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- **A.** New IRB member Chandra Commuri is attending his first meeting.
- **B.** The recent informal Q/A IRB info session was summarized. Another is coming up on W, 12-07.
- **C.** Four webinar-style demos of possible software to handle grants, IRB, and IACUC are coming up. IRB members and other faculty are invited to attend. Gwen will send out formal invites.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

A. CITI HSPT and Recertification

Most IRB members have explored various modules and aspects of the training. It is not clear which ones to take, given that there are around 35 that come up, for example those for IRB Members, those for Researchers [and what kind of research?], and as a Refresher. There was a consensus that the materials are well thought out. CSUB has had a license for these for a few years. The "responsible conduct of research" materials are required for NSF and NIH projects. A task group [McCleary, Commuri, Olson] will focus on selecting subsets of modules for persons in particular roles to take. Gwen will explore adding faculty as graders or instructors in CITI so that they can see students' scores. We will wait to develop policy on recertification.

V. New Business

This flurry of policy and procedure items is prompted by realization that: [a] there are pitfalls in having quite a few "traditions" that are not written down as policy and [b] the need for more systematic record keeping to document the actions of the IRB, especially in case of an external audit.

- A. Protocol Renewal Timeframe. RERC has traditionally allowed PIs to renew a protocol within a "grace period" after it has formally closed. This could create a problem if something went wrong in research that was being conducted outside of an authorization period. It was noted that PIs are informed of the closure date in three ways: [a] in their authorization letter, [b] in their "impending closure" letter, and [c] in their "final closure letter" in which they are specifically told to stop interacting with subjects. One element of the present proposal is to no longer allow late renewals "closed is closed". A second element is that yearly review of protocols is required; therefore, renewal or resubmission of a protocol should require a progress report or summary of activities carried out during the authorization period, which would be reviewed in considering the renewal or resubmission. We will need to develop a form for this. It was decided to also initiate a brief, voluntary closure report at the end of the authorization period even if there is no renewal or resubmission. Communi moved/Velasquez seconded, 8-0.
- **B. RERC Email Protocol Approvals.** Traditionally in cases of time urgency, when a protocol is "good to go" the RERC has informed the PI via email that the research may go forth, with the formal authorization letter to follow. It was decided to continue to allow this, but that this should be formalized in policy/procedure language that states that such an email has standing, so that the research is authorized as of the date of the email. Herndon moved/Olson seconded. 8-0.
- C. Progress Report Policy. This was covered in the new renewal policy [above].
- **D.** Appointment of Alternate IRB Members. Yet another tradition. Departing IRB members are appointed as alternate IRB members, primarily to serve if needed to achieve a meeting quorum. Procedure is the same as for appointment of regular IRB members RERC nominates to CSUB Academic Senate, Senate advises the Academic Provost, and Provost appoints. There was a motion to make this a policy. Velasquez moved/Herndon seconded, 8-0.

- E. What Venues = Reviewable Research? Presentations in class of class projects = no. Written product filed in library or presentation in a university-wide venue, such as the Psy Chi Research Conference or Student Research Scholars = yes. There is a gray area in between where there is doubt and uncertainty as in a recent case in which acting RERC and RERC made different calls. It comes down to the nature of the audience. We need to make consistent the IMPHSR form, which probably needs revision, and any words we add to website and/or policy/procedure document. We should give examples of venues requiring IRB review and authorization and that IRB should be contacted for guidance in cases where there is uncertainty. Duran moved/Commuri seconded, 8-0.
- **F. CSUB Senate Resolution 161702 [Research Misconduct].** RERC informed members about this resolution, which put in place a necessary program to prevent and deal with research misconduct. It is noted that this does not include anything dealing with non-compliance with IRB review and authorization procedures or regulations. This leads to the next item.
- **G. IRB Non-Compliance.** We have no policy. The IRB and RERC have quite a history dealing with the overall policy question and specific instances of noncompliance, but no formal policy has ever been proposed. Present, traditional procedure is for the RERC and IRB Chair to conduct an investigation, including interviews of the parties involved, when alleged cases surface. A formal report is then sent to students and faculty involved, and the administrative chain of command up to the Academic Provost. The IRB reasoned some time ago that egregious cases would be filed with the CSUB Committee on Professional Responsibility. The reasoning for this is that faculty are required to conform their conduct to CSUB policies; one policy is to implement the federal regulations on human subject protections. Therefore, IRB noncompliance would be subject to sanctions. However, the Committee on Professional Responsibilities has no enforcement powers. IRB has no enforcement powers beyond ordering human research to cease if participants are being harmed. There appeared to be agreement that IRB noncompliance should have consequences. This would require CSUB Senate action, probably and might burn off some of the IRB's good karma. However, it is not good the CSUB students can satisfy degree requirements and faculty can achieve promotion and tenure on the basis of noncompliant human subjects research. RERC argued that it would be desirable for any such policy to originate from the IRB rather than descending from on high. Also Sumaya, the RERC, should be involved in developing policy. McCleary and Sumaya were charged with developing a draft policy for further consideration. Procedurally, this issue was tabled for now.
- H. Policy on PI Meeting Attendance. Tradition [There's that word again!] has it that the PI must be present for a Standard Review in a meeting. Also IRB requires faculty mentors of student PI's to be present. Unfortunate instances in which a faculty mentor failed to show up and the students had an unpleasant experience were presented. It was agreed that the above attendance requirements should be IRB policy. Communi moved/Duran seconded. 8-0.

- I. Selection of Outstanding IRB Protocol. This would be for AY 2015-2016 for recognition at the 2016 Research Excellence Day. There was a discussion about the procedures used for the previous, and first, such selection. The RERC was charged with picking out three and sending them out to IRB members for a vote. This is thought to be what happened last year.

XI. Continuing Review of Authorized Protocols

Protocol 07-91. "Evaluation for Kern County Children and Families Commission [KCCFC]". J. J. Wang. Quarterly Report and Annual Renewal. Primary readers are all members.

The PI summarized: Consent form use and confidentiality training continues as required in Protocol 07-91. The yearly report to the state this fall highlighted the Ready to Start program which includes over 20 CSUB student interns in their preschool programs. In addition, an intern has been hired directly to F5K from the CSUB PPA program. The relationship between CSUB and F5K continues to build community connections. There have been several presentations and one impending journal articles based on data collected under Protocol 07-91.

The PI was asked to find out if the new person doing confidentiality training is certified in human subjects protection training. The PI will report back to the Board.

The PI was asked to leave the room and the Board discussed Protocol 07-91 in executive session. There was a motion to accept the quarterly report and renew Protocol 07-91 for an additional year. Velasquez moved/Commuri seconded, 8-0.

The PI was informed when he returned and congratulated for his good work on behalf of the human subjects involved in the F5K programs.

XII. Review of New Protocols

Protocol 16-155 [Monique Willis, Psychology]. "Minority Parents' ASD Narratives Study".

Following introductions, the PI summarized. "Minority Parents' Autism Spectrum Disorder Narratives Study." The PI would like to study the impact of ASD on minority populations. Research related to ASD and minority families is scarce. The proposed research is a qualitative study that focuses on issues related to raising a child between the ages of 2 to 18 who has been diagnosed with ASD. Study participants will be recruited from minority populations and a couple dynamic will be a focus. Questions followed.

[Q: Question A: Answer C: Comment]

- Q: Please clarify the level of respondent in the research. Is it individual, couple, or group, and are there differences of how you will approach each level? A: It will be all three. Questions in the interview guide are general enough to cover each level of respondent.
- **Q:** You use the term "psychotherapist" in the protocol and informed consent related to adverse reactions. Please change this to the broader term: "mental health professional." **A:** Agreed.

- **Q:** On the parent questionnaire form, please add something that indicates the confidentiality of the questionnaire. **A:** Agreed.
- **C:** PI discussed the issue of concerns about adverse reactions. She stated that in a prior similar study, some respondents did have some anxiety, however, some thought that the interview was a cathartic experience, and that participants would be able to get some insight into issues of parenting an ASD child.
- Q: During an interview, can a participant opt out of the audiotaping of the interview? A: Yes. C: Please make this clear in the consent and protocol. A: Agreed.
- **Q:** Who will be transcribing the interviews? **A:** An out-of-state professional transcribing service.
- Q: Do you have a form specific to the research that transcribers can sign to ensure confidentiality? A: No, but I can get one. C: Follow up: See if there is an example that PI can use.
- **Q:** Where will the interviews take place? **A:** It depends on the needs of the participants. Most of the time (about 75%), the interviews are done in the home.
- **Q:** What about safety issues related to this? **A:** I will have at least one student with me when doing the data collection.
- **C:** Please state in the protocol and informed consent where the interviews will be taking place and that participants' privacy will be ensured during the interviews. **A:** Agreed. **C:** All students have or will be taking the CITI HSP Training. The students involved have also had experience with ASD.
- **Q:** Please describe the data analysis. **A:** I will use a grounded theory method. Data will be analyzed line by line using focused and then axial coding. Students will be involved in this process to ensure validity and trustworthiness of the analysis.
- **Q:** What about participants who speak Spanish? **A:** I will be excluding monolingual Spanish speakers due to the lack of resources at this time. **C:** Please note this in the participant exclusion criteria.
- **Q:** You use the term "short" interviews in the consent form. Ninety minutes may not be considered a "short" interview. Can you please omit "short?" **A:** Agreed.
- Q: There is an inconsistency when referring to participants' income level. Are you targeting low and middle income or just low income? A: I broadened the population to both low and middle. C: Please make this consistent in the protocol. A: Agreed.
- **Q:** Can you clarify access to mental health services? **A:** Yes, I will include additional resources in the consent form.

The PI was asked to leave the room and the Board discussed Protocol 16-155 in executive session. Following discussion there was a motion to conditionally approve Protocol 16-155. Velasquez moved/Duran seconded, 8-0.

When the PI returned she was so informed and the following conditions were announced to her:

- 1. Clarify level of respondent in the protocol
- 2. Change the term "psychotherapist" to "mental health professional"
- 3. Add language about confidentiality in the parent questionnaire.
- 4. State in the protocol and informed consent that interviewees can opt out of audiotaping of the interview.
- 5. Provide a signed confidentiality form to be used by professional transcribers
- 6. State where interviews will take place and how you will ensure privacy in the protocol and informed consent
- 7. Give more detailed information related to analysis of data
- 8. List under participant exclusion criteria, that persons who do not speak English will not be included in the study.
- 9. Take out "short" interview in the consent form (replace with just "interview")
- 10. Make the protocol consistent when referring to low and middle income participants
- 11. Clarify access to mental health resources on the consent form.
