### I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Paul Newberry called the meeting to order promptly at 8:00 AM.

### **II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

### **III. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- **A.** Departing member, Lily Alvarez, was celebrated for 7 years of service on the IRB. She was thanked as she prepares to retire from KCMH, with contentment.
- **B.** The new AVP for GRaSP is Dr. Imeh Ebong, who will probably not be a "hands on" presence with respect to the IRB. He has experience with IRBNet at his previous institution and has been told that the RERC and Gwen were rebuffed in their attempt to obtain IRBNet for IRB document management.
- **C.** Randy Schultz is returning to the IRB in Fall 2014, Alteparmakian's appointment having been on an interim basis.

### IV. OLD BUSINESS

- **A. More Changing of the Guard.** McCleary remains "willing" to Chair; Duran has actual "interest" in chairing sometime in the future when other events are less pressing. Newberry may be able to continue beyond AY 2014-2015. It appears that, one way or the other, the Chair transition will be covered. Isabel Sumaya will be appointed as the next RERC as soon as issues involving reimbursement to SSE/psychology have been resolved. This will probably involve a three-way discussion among Coley, Ebong, and Knutzen.
- **B. Dedicated IRB Software.** The Qualtrics site license for CSUB has been purchased. It is user-friendly, but definitely not specifically designed for our particular needs. There may be a training involving RERC and Gwen on Monday.

### F. New Protocol Reviews

**1. Protocol 14-69.** "College Student Perceptions of the N-Word in the Post-Civil Rights Era" with Rhonda Dugan and Dahna Rasmussen, Sociology. Primary readers are Alvarez, Duran, Gamboa.

The PI's summarized. This follows up on Rasmussen's thesis protect, reviewed last year. They want to look at college student use of the n-word, which appears to have slipped into casual usage. They wonder why this is. Black students report using this as a term of endearment. Now this seems to be the case among non-blacks. Will do in-depth interviews to try to find the motivation involved, and decision-making in word usage. There appears to be a generational difference. The sample will involve CSUB and BC students.

**Q:** Are you interesting in what is happening or why it's happening? **A:** Both, what the usage is, why they talk that way, and what it means.

**Q:** You say that it matters who says what to whom, but is your idea that the "sting" has disappeared? **A:** It could be that now race doesn't matter. We'll have to see what emerges from the interview data. Perhaps we've entered a time of "post-racial ideology".

**Q:** Who will transcribe the interviews? **A:** We're thinking that would be the PI's, but that would involve a lot of time.

**Q:** Won't you need to listen to the audio to get the inflection on -er/-ah. **A:** We both plan to listen to all of the audio.

**Q:** Who will do the interviews? **A:** Won't the race of the interviewer make a big difference? **A:** We're aware of the issues associated with this variable.

Q: How will you do subject recruitment? Will students inside the department be involved? Students in the classroom are classified as vulnerable, but how about majors know to the Pl's or who know the Pl's and might take courses from them?

A: There will be a variety of recruitment methods – in classrooms and using an existing database of potential volunteers from Rasmussen's thesis project.

**Q:** So, you have some interested participants and it will snowball from there? **A:** Pretty much.

**Q:** How will you analyze the data? **A:** This will be mainly at the level of hand coding into emerging categories.

**Q:** Seems like a number of variables could be important, such as gender, SES, education level, mass media effects. Why are you just looking at college students? **A:** We looked and gender and SES in the thesis but did not find significant effects. Will look more closely in this follow-up. However, we will avoid being "leading", since this is a qualitative approach.

**Q:** Won't your approach to subject recruitment lead to a rather homogeneous sample of persons having similar backgrounds? Why not do some kind of random sampling? **A:** We're really looking at people who use the n-word as endearment.

**Q:** So you're specifically studying a sub-culture, and not attempting to determine how common this usage has become? **A:** Correct.

**Q:** Why get students from BC? **A:** The research started there and the BC demographics are a little different from CSUB.

**Q:** You say you will terminate if a subject gets upset. How will you know that? **A:** From body language, overtly expressed affect. We'll specifically ask if it is OK to continue if concerned.

C: Your additional interviewers will need to be carefully trained.

**C:** It would be a good idea to instruct or query the subjects prior to the interview about the existence of a possible meaning of the two terms —ah/-er and whether they perceive a difference. **A:** Good idea.

**Q:** Do you have an upper age limit? **A:** We're not planning on doing that, but it does pose the possibility of a generational difference.

Q: Will you interview non-students, if the snowball rolls in that direction? A: No.

When there were no more questions, the PI's were asked to leave and the Board deliberated in executive session. There was a motion to conditionally approve Protocol 14-69, Duran moved, Alvarez seconded, 7-0. The PI's returned and were informed of the conditions, which were:

- 1. One primary researcher must be "available" when each interview is conducted due to the relatively high risk of adverse reactions.
- 2. Additional interviewers besides the PI's must be carefully trained in recognizing signs of distress and must be HSPT-certified before they participate. Their names must be provided to the IRB.
- 3. The transcriber[s] must sign a confidentiality pledge and be HSPT-certified. Their names must be provided to the IRB.
- 4. Add the KCMH 24/7 hotline for a possible adverse reaction contact.
- 5. Provide your identities to the subjects and the courses that you teach in case dynamics emerge during interviews suggesting that subjects might be uncomfortable having you for instructors.

### G. Continuing Review of Authorized Protocols

**1. Protocol 07-91 Report**. "Evaluation for Kern County Children and Families Commission [KCCFC]" with J. J. Wang. Primary readers are all members.

The PI summarized. Site visits and confidentiality training continued as usual. There was an incident reported in which a briefcase containing a signed consent form was stolen from a vehicle after a home visit.

**Q:** How could this have been avoided? **A:** Probably impossible.

**C:** KCMH has a reporting process for confidentiality violations that is used for risk analysis.

- Q: Did you talk to the client? A: No, the identity of the client was not shared with me.
- Q: Were you informed promptly of the incident? A: Yes. I found out about it right away.
- **C:** There was a discussion among Board members about the role of the IRB in protecting information at agencies such as KCMH and the various F5K agencies.
- **Q:** Were you responsible for reporting the incident to the authorities? A: No, only for reporting it to the IRB.

The PI departed. There was a motion to approve the quarterly report for Protocol 07-91, Alvarez moved, McCleary seconded, 6-0.

When the PI returned, he was informed that the IRB believes that the incident was handled appropriately, including that the PI was promptly notified of the incident. The PI inquired about a memo of support for him in his efforts to enhance the quality of the evaluation data involved for F5K. The IRB agreed to pursue this.

2. Edvention and Related Report. With Randy Schultz. Primary readers are all members.

Schultz summarized. **Protocol 13-84**. A small group of doctoral students has been added. This involves additional surveys and focus groups. The external evaluator will run focus groups. **Protocol 11-66**. CAM will expire without renewal. **Protocol 11-68**. This is not active and probably will not be renewed. **Protocol 11-117**. Wright is supposed to provide some information this summer. An issue is that the state test used previously was not administered the last year and a new test is going to be used this year. **Protocol 11-122**. This has been closed for a while. **Protocol 13-117**. This will lead to a publication for submission to be prepared this summer. **Protocol 14-05**. This is the "co-teaching model" and self-efficacy. This is a Lamont program with a 3-week training program. A "resident" program is planned for more "on site" participation by student teachers. They have a swell video of one of their trainees. They are going to submit a grant to follow up on edvention.

Board members had no questions. Schultz was invited to leave and the Board deliberated in executive session. There was a motion to approve the quarterly report, Gilchrist moved, Herndon seconded, 7-0.

When Schultz returned he was informed of the result, complimented on a good job, and encouraged to keep it up. Schultz noted that big projects are a learning experience.

### H. Renewal of Authorized Protocols

**1. Protocol 03-03.** "Psychology Department Subject Pool" with Carol Raupp. Primary readers are all members.

The PI summarized. The psychology subject pool has been operating under this protocol since 2003. Only IRB-approved studies may use the subject pool. Up to 5% of the course grade is based on research participation or completion of an alternative assignment, with the choice of alternatives left to the student. There is often a "mismatch" between supply and demand, with fall having many students and fewer research opportunities, but winter and spring having fewer students but more research. There have been no complaints from students to the PI, the psychology chair, the instructors, or posted on the research participation bulletin board. The present submission is a renewal request with several modifications: [a] Extends potential users to all psychology faculty, not just tenured and tenuretrack; [b] Specifies that online survey-type participation is acceptable if there is a mechanism to verify participation and recruitment is via a posting on the sign-up board as for other research opportunities. [c] Psychology faculty will be reminded annually of the participant pool procedures. [d] Faculty and students will not visit the PSYC 100 classroom to recruit participants. [e] The PI will notify the PSYC 100 instructors as research projects are approved by her for subject pool use. [f] When the IRB approves a study to use the participant pool, the IRB is requested to include a specific, standard statement to that effect in the authorization letter [which is then included in the application to use the subject pool that is given to the PI].

**Q:** Do these issues really involve the IRB or is this just a matter for the department? **A:** the PI and RERC argued that operation of the subject pool involves human subjects protections and so it is within the purview of the IRB. The PI was invited to leave.

There was a motion to approve renewal of Protocol 03-03, including the proposed modifications. Alvarez moved, Gamboa seconded, 5-0-1.

    - RERC reported that this review went quickly and smoothly.
  - 2. Protocol 14-27 [Justin C. Van Orsdol & Abbas Grammy, BPA] "The Effects of Leadership: An Evaluation of the Directorate of Contracting at Edwards AFB, CA" Submitted 4-07-14; authorized 4-08-14, following exemption from full review.

There was a general discussion of the nature of the projects and protocols involving students enrolled in the online MSA program. Should these be held to the same standards used to review other proposed human subjects research projects, including other graduate culminating projects? Are these perhaps more like course assignments and, if so, would not require review? Are these filed in the library? It might be useful to make available an example of a model IRB protocol from someone in business or public administration. The RERC was charged with initiating discussions with Abbas Grammy and relevant administrators to clarify. The Chair will be involved in said discussions.
