How to Register a Specific Concern about Animal Use

The use of every animal at CSUB must be authorized in advance under a protocol that has been reviewed and approved by the IACUC. Several documents are to be posted in the room where the animals are used or with the investigator for field studies:

1. The protocol itself
2. The authorization letter from the IACUC listing conditions of animal use
3. This notice, indicating how to register concerns

If you have a specific concern about treatment of animals, first please review the above materials. If you believe that there has been a protocol violation, register your concern either in person or by phone with any of the members of the IACUC. The current members are:
