PEGGY LEAPLEY, PHD, APRN

Post Masters FNP certificate from CSUB 1999, Indiana University (BSN), University of Michigan at Ann Arbor (Masters of Public Health Nursing), University of Texas at Austin (PhD) Nursing Career focused on psychiatric/mental health nursing, public health and children/adolescents



Peggy was employed at CSUB in the Department of Nursing for 31 years. She has twice been chair of the department; from 1999 to 2002 and 2006 to 2008. Her primary teaching areas include community health, research and family practice. Her scholarly activities include over 30 local, state, national and international presentations, and a number of national publications. Her most notable contributions to the university have been on the Academic Senate and Executive Committee, University Budget Advisory Committee, the Central Valley Health Policy Institute and as a member of the CSU Chancellor's Office's Doctoral

Education in Nursing committee.

Her community service includes part-time pediatric nursing work at Kern Medical Center, service as a part-time school nurse with the Delano Union Elementary School District and a part-time run as a nurse practitioner with Terry Medical Clinic and Wasco clinic. Peggy volunteered at the Kern County Public Health Department by teaching the Nursing Child Assessment Satellite Training Scale and assisting with interviews for public health nurse promotions. From 2012 to 2017 she was employed part-time at the Gloria Nelson Center for Women and Children in Delano as a family nurse practitioner. She has written or collaborated on multiple grants for CSUB and the community. After retiring from CSUB, she returned for four years to coordinate CSUB's role in the National Children's Study in collaboration with the University of California, Irvine. After retiring from active clinical practice, she became a volunteer for the American Red Cross, Kern-Eastern Sierra Chapter. She served as the academic student learning coordinator and is a member of the disaster health service team. Peggy continues to support faculty through her Leapley Doctoral Scholarship offered through the Xi Epsilon chapter of Sigma.

TERRI CHURCH, MSNA, RN, NEA-BC

Vice President, Chief Operating Officer



Terri Church has been a nurse in California's Central Valley for over 40 years. She has been recognized by her peers for her strength in leadership. She currently serves as Vice President and Chief Operating Officer (COO) for Memorial Hospital. Terri has been with Dignity Health since 2008, serving as Vice President and Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) as well as Chief Nursing Officer for the Dignity Health Central California Division for the past two years.

Terri holds two degrees from California State University, Bakersfield, including a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and a Master of Science in Nursing Administration. As CNO, Terri has helped oversee an extraordinary expansion of local health care services at Memorial Hospital, including comprehensive pediatric services, oncology, stroke and catastrophic burn care. She has been a passionate advocate for nursing education, and thoughtfully balanced the care of patients with the emotional toll it has taken on nurses during the COVID-19 pandemic. Terri's career in health care spans four decades, including 26 years at Adventist Health (formerly San Joaquin Community Hospital) where she served as Vice President of Patient Care, and two years as Director of Nursing at Comprehensive Blood and Cancer Center before joining the Memorial Hospital team in 2008.

As a leader, Terri encourages nurses to pursue advanced degrees, mentors young nurse leaders and collaborates with the CSUB and Bakersfield College RN programs. She oversaw implementation of the Versant RN New Graduate Nurse Residency Program in 2009, which has produced nearly 700 clinically-competent nurses, improving patient care and growing the nursing leadership ranks. Under Terri's leadership, Memorial achieved the ANCC Pathway to Excellence Designation in 2016 and re-designation in 2019 and has launched the High Reliability Organization (HRO) journey in 2021.

Terri has been recognized by Kern County's chapter of the Association of Nurse Leaders, the Bakersfield College Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee and the Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor Society. She also received the CSUB Nightingale Award for excellence in nursing and, most recently, was inducted as a 2022 member of the California State University, Bakersfield Alumni Hall of Fame.


