Phase I - Foundation and Basic Understanding

The first phase of the program provides insight into how students in special education relate to today's classroom.

Phase II - Skill Development

During the second phase candidates will acquire knowledge and skills to assess, support, and manage environments for students with special needs.

Phase III - Culminating Activities

In the final phase of the program candidates will exemplify what they have learned by completing a culminating activity.

Application Process

The application process is a two-step process.

- 1. Apply to the university
- 2. Apply to the program

Step 1 – Applying the university

- Submit a graduate application on Cal State Apply: <u>calstate.edu/apply/graduate</u>
- Pay the \$70.00 fee to submit your application
- Send one official transcript from every college/university attended. Electronic delivery is recommended.

- Requirements:
 - Hold a bachelor's degree
 - Minimum of 2.5 GPA
 - Be in good standing from last college or university attended
 - Meet the professional, personal, scholastic, and other standards of graduate study.

Step 2 - Applying to the program

 Submit a complete program application and supporting documents by the program deadline.

A complete application includes:

- Program application
- Autobiography
- Three recommendations sent to admission advisor (<u>Form</u>)
- Copy of teaching credential or signed MOU that candidate will not be teaching during the program.
- TB Clearance
- Mandated Reporter Training Certificate for School Personnel

All documents except for recommendations are to be merged into one PDF file and uploaded to the submission portal.

- Eligible applicants will be contacted to complete a program interview.
- Applicants will be notified by email regarding their application. If admitted to the master's program, you will receive an admission letter with further instructions and requirements to complete your program.
