For Allison Burrowes, MA Social Work, BA Sociology pursuing a graduate education at CSUB was about more than earning degrees—it was about discovering her purpose. As the 2023 Rising 'Runner Award recipient, Alison has used her passion for helping others to launch a meaningful career in program development and student support. Her story is a reminder that curiosity and compassion go a long way.



When Dr. Janet Barnett Pierucci stepped onto CSUB's campus in the 1970s, she had no idea how transformative those years would be. As a first-generation college student, she leaned on the support of her professors and peers to navigate unfamiliar territory. Her time at CSUB sparked a passion for psychology and gave her the tools to understand human behavior, trauma, and healing. She earned both her bachelor's and master's

degrees here, building a foundation that would carry her through decades of meaningful work in the field of clinical psychology. She eventually went on to earn a Ph.D. and worked as a licensed psychologist, helping countless individuals through challenges involving trauma, grief, and mental health.

Now retired, Dr. Pierucci looks back on CSUB as the place that shaped her confidence and gave her a sense of direction. Her story is one of resilience, growth, and community—values she has carried into every aspect of her professional life. In recognition of her contributions to mental health and her dedication to helping others, CSUB will honor her as one of the 2025 Alumni Hall of Fame inductees. For Dr. Pierucci, the honor is more than an award—it's a full-circle moment that reflects just how deeply her alma mater impacted her journey.

CSUB has announced the 2025 class of Alumni Hall of Fame inductees, recognizing exceptional graduates for their achievements and lasting contributions to their fields and communities. The honorees include Donna Barba Higuera (B.S. Biology, '91), an award winning author of children's literature, Dr. Janet Barnett Pierucci (B.A. & M.S. Psychology, 72', '76), a clinical psychologist and longtime advocate for mental health and education; Judge Elizabet Rodriguez (B.A. Criminal Justice, '00), the first Spanish-speaking Latina judicial officer in Kern County Superior Court; and Dan Shanyfelt (B.S. Business Administration, '97), founder and CEO of Miramar International Real Estate & Investment



Each honoree exemplifies what's possible with a CSUB degree. From writing award-winning children's literature and building a billion-dollar real estate company, to expanding mental health access and breaking barriers in the courtroom, their stories highlight leadership, resilience, and service. The induction ceremony took place on February 20, 2025, during Homecoming Week. As Director of Alumni Engagement Sarah Hendrick shared, "Donna, Janet, Elizabet, and Dan are inspirational leaders." For Hilda Cárdenas, B.A. in Liberal Studies, the path to becoming an educator was deeply personal. A first-generation college graduate from Lamont, she grew up attending schools in the same district where she'll soon begin her teaching career. Inspired by the CSU Bakersfield diplomas she saw in her childhood classrooms, she set her sights on CSUB early. "I always thought it was so cool to see those diplomas on the wall," she recalls. "I wanted to go there—or at least visit. Now I've done both."

At CSUB, Cárdenas found more than just a degree—she found a community. She built a strong support system through staff and peers, especially in the Cultivando Maestras/os Kern Multilingual Residency Program, which placed her in a fifth-grade dual immersion classroom in the Lamont Elementary School District. Through the program, she earned her multiple subject credential and a bilingual authorization in Spanish. "This program taught me to be proud of my name, my language and my culture," she says. "And I want my students to feel the same."


Cárdenas returns to Lamont this July as a full-time teacher, with future plans to pursue a master's and eventually teach at CSUB.

HILDA CÁRDENAS | CSU BAKERSFIELD MULTIPLE SUBJECT TEACHING CREDENTIAL Mia Gangle, a psychology major, recently published a peer-reviewed article "Social Psychological Profiling Model of Victimization and Perpetration Processes Involved in Sex Trafficking". Her work not only proposed a profiling model and a four-step prevention plan, but it has already begun influencing legislation at the state level.

Reflecting on her experience, Mia urges professors to mentor undergraduate research and reminds students to be confident in their academic abilities. She hopes her article inspires others to pursue meaningful scholarship early in their academic careers.

#### **FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS**






